

Citations Seminar:

How to avoid plagiarism and use citations properly

Course Description: This seminar is for students who will be/are writing research papers for coursework, either in undergraduate or graduate programs. Although a full paper is not written in the class, students can bring in papers they have worked on or are working on. Students will learn how to both incorporate the ideas of other authors into their writing and to create an organized and correct references page. Stress will be placed on how to make this topic engaging and easy, not boring and difficult.

Textbook: Students do not need to purchase books. All materials will be provided by the instructor. Students should, however, bring writing materials (pen, B5 loose leaf paper).
